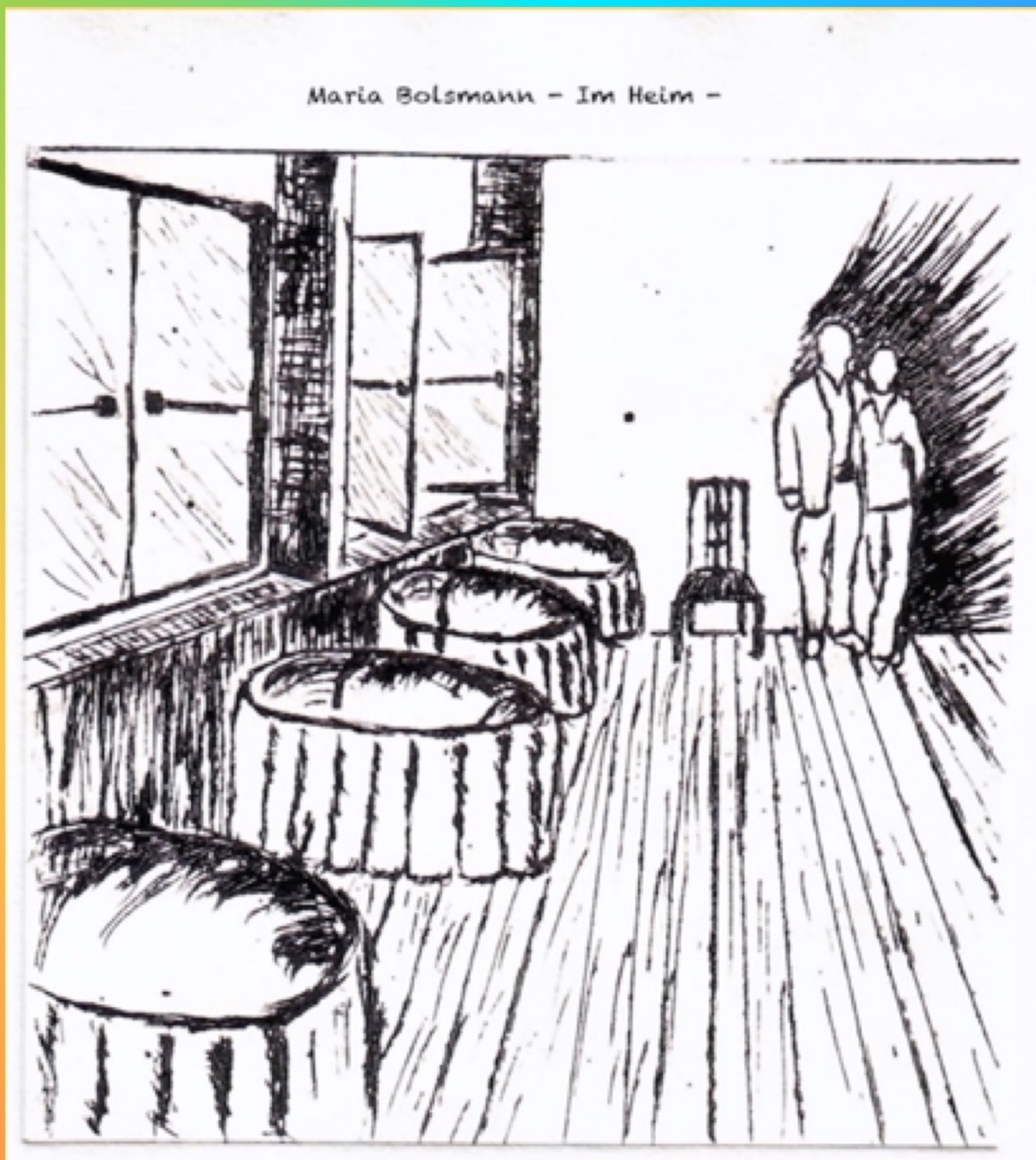

You will also find enclosed facilities here. This includes closed institutions in Germany as well as the homes of the former GDR.

These houses also include those where only the place, the name and the category but not the exact address of the house is known.

# Questions and answers

## *What is meant by reopening?*

It means that the respective Children's Home (asylum) already has existed under another name or carrier. If the former name and the year of closure of the Children's Home are known, this was noted.

## *What does "no further information or any successor device" mean?*

This means that the institution exists or has existed, but no further information can be found on this facility.

## *Are these always the current addresses?*

Yes and No. The current facilities are marked as active and these addresses are up to date. The others are marked with "no further information or no successor known". Mainly from institutions in the new federal states from the time of the former GDR, we often only know the address. It is also not known whether the streets have been renamed.

## *Are you familiar with all the renamed streets?*

No, that's impossible. Not every city or municipality announces street renaming. In addition, there are always "renaming waves", a time when a lot of renaming of streets takes place. Such a wave is happening right now, because of problematic street names dating back to the time of the Third Reich. As far as renamed streets are known, this is noted at the respective institution.

There are facilities and streets in your address data, which have been renamed several times. Does the arrangement of these names match the order of renaming?

Limited. In some cases, the order is known, in others this arrangement or naming of the successor names is arbitrary.

## *Why do you have so many facilities without addresses?*

99% of these are institutions from the former GDR. The information on these facilities is limited to the place and the name.

# Home education in Germany

Children and their education in homes have always existed and is thus the oldest and best known form of education. However, today's home-learning cannot be compared with state education institutions and orphanages from the past either by name or pedagogical approach. Since the home scandals, youth welfare has been fundamentally reformed.

Home education is and is regulated by law. In the case of physical parents, the educational competence is limited or has been ascertained in the case of growing abnormalities in social behavior. This should be averted or counteracted to the threat to childhood. Youth services provide facilities for this purpose. The purpose of these institutions is to provide children who are temporarily or no longer able to live in their home family, to provide a child-suitable home and to educate them to grow responsible members of society. The youth welfare program provides semi- and full-station programs as aids to education.

The in-patient accommodation of children and adolescents is only applied if it requires a special situation and thus the education of the child or adolescents in the family is no longer guaranteed. Children's Homes have always had an abnormal value in society and the children were branded.

The Kinderheim scandals have not contributed to the improvement of this reputation.

Only slowly a rethinking of society takes place. The word "Children's Home" today does not exist in common language-use with authorities and offices. For many children family-oriented housing groups are an opportunity to live their childhood and adolescence outside their home family.

In these residential groups and other educational institutions of this kind, well-educated educational staff cares lovingly for the children and young people. Whatever form of home education is concerned, the aim is to allow a child or a young person to return to the family or to be admitted to a family.

Since many children are traumatized by certain situations and/or events, they need therapeutic and/or healing education support.

Various programs and offers are available in these youth welfare facilities, e.g. Speech-, exercise- and behavior therapy as well as behavioral and experiential education etc. In the last few years, the reference education system has emerged as a special educational success.

The child or teenager has a special person who is always the first contact person for all personal needs. This means that the adolescent has a reliable reference person. In-patient home education cannot replace an intact family, but it can be a loving support for the child and adolescents on their way.

# Types of equipment

The form of the original children's and educational centers no longer exists today. Today's facilities are mostly run by foundations, churches or free institutions. There are many differences in location, offers, sizes and forms of care.

**The following accommodation concepts exist today:**

## *Youth groups*

Residential groups are the most common form of youth development. The young people are usually accommodated in an apartment. The people concerned are looked after and cared for by the educators and social pedagogues around the clock. A further accommodation is also possible in homes, which consist of several houses. Large educational groups do longer exist. The atmosphere and structure is becoming more and more familiar, today's groups consist of a maximum of 8-10 youngsters. It is also possible to divide the groups by age. Toddlers' homes or youth hostels are an example. Other facilities are specifically tailored to specific problems, such as drugs or abuse.

## *Education*

Educational centers focus on the individuality of the child or adolescents concerned.

This support takes place in the household of a specialist, mostly with social pedagogical training. These educational institutions are usually offered by independent institutions.

## *Assisted living*

with this form of living the young people are also looked after by the teachers. There are so-called self-employment groups, which usually consist of the elder youth. The goal of these groups is to learn to live an independent life. The young people have a contact person who does not live permanently in the group, but rather visits the residential groups at certain times or when the need arises.

## *Child care and mother-child care*

In these institutions, mothers are cared for with their children. There is single and group accommodation. They are often integrated into youth groups, but are screened from the other young people (separate groups). Here, too, the family care form is usually chosen. In "SOS Kinderdörfern", the children are supervised by an SOS Kinderdorf Mutter, the family character of the house or village always takes precedence here.

## *Closed accommodation*

These are facilities with measures for the removal of personal liberties. Such an institution may be

admitted only on application and by court order. The reason for this can be delinquency, threat to others or oneself. Simultaneous psychiatric treatment is not foreseen. This form of care is very controversial. The best example is the Haasenburg in Brandenburg.

### ***Short-term accommodation, clearing***

A long separation of children and young people from their custodians is not always necessary in order to resolve conflicts. A short residence time (days to several weeks) always means a large fluctuation in the groups. The best example is the taking-over by the juvenile offices. In some cases, there are the so-called clearing points in the federal states.

### ***Mixed forms/variants***

There are different versions of the basic concepts.

As an example, the social-educational dwelling groups serve a higher need for care in order to meet the personal needs of children and adolescents. There is a therapeutic approach in these residential groups. The therapeutic approach does not apply to housing communities with increased need for care.
